2021 Junior Ranger Program Guide



Between Virginia’s mountains and its sea lies the Piedmont. We have a wealth of wildlife and vegetation. As a Junior Ranger, you’ll see what makes our part of Virginia so special, and learn some skills that helped our ancestors survive.

What is the Junior Ranger Program?

The program is a series of activities for youths between 5 and 12 years of age. There are options for self-guided (with a responsible adult) and ranger-led activities. Participants will learn recreation *and* conservation. They will explore the environment and ecology of the area while learning about outdoor skills.

To become an official Junior Ranger, a trainee must complete 5 (five) of the activities, plus the self guided items listed in the brochure, in any combination.

Prizes

Once you have completed any 5 activities and the self guided list, return with your guidebook to the park office. There you will receive a Junior Ranger Badge.
