Dear Hunter,

Thank you for choosing to participate in the Kiptopeke State Park Deer Hunt. Enclosed in this packet you'll find the following information:

- A non-transferrable reservation confirmation email
- Terms and Conditions
- A required items list
- Hunt map and Avenza instructions

Please carefully review all the documents in this packet. Each hunter will need to sign the Terms and Conditions sheet to confirm they have read, understood, and will abide by the stated conditions. Hunters under the age of 18 must also have a parent/guardian's signature.

We encourage you to visit the park during normal park hours (8:00 a.m. to dusk) to familiarize yourself with your stand/zone location. Park staff may be available to answer questions or direct you to your stand/zone location between 9 A.M. and 4 P.M. During your pre-hunt scouting trip, you may only park in parking lots and not along roadsides. Normal parking fees apply. It may be necessary to hike or bicycle to remote zones.

The park will open for hunter check-in at 4:30 A.M. All hunters must check-in at our Maintenance Shop located at 3428 Main Avenue, Cape Charles, VA 23310 by 5:15 A.M. Late arrivals will forfeit their reservation to stand-by hunters. A mandatory pre-hunt safety briefing will take place at the check station at 5:20 A.M. Hunters must checkout at the maintenance shop by 6:30 P.M. A stand-by drawing will be conducted by 5:15 AM each day to fill vacant spots. A second drawing will be held at 1:00 PM each day to fill any zones that have been vacated by hunters. You are welcome to come any or all days of the hunt, to hunt stand-by.

Remember, our goal is to stabilize the size of the herd by removing mature does. Every hunter must harvest a doe (antlerless deer) before taking a buck (antlered). DMAP tags are available for your use for harvested does. Antlered deer must be checked on your own tags.

Kiptopeke State Park Managed Deer Hunt Permit

2023 Terms and Conditions

The following information, terms and conditions apply to the managed deer hunts in Virginia State Parks. Any violation will result in revocation of permit and elimination of your participation in any hunting programs sponsored by the Division of State Parks and possible criminal charges.

1. The special archery/muzzleloader deer hunt will be held on Wednesday November 8 and Thursday November 9. The special archery/muzzleloader/shotgun hunt will be held on Wednesday December 6 and Thursday December 7.
 - Five zones will be available for one hunter plus one buddy each day.
 - Seven stands are available for one hunter per reservation each day.
2. Check-in time is between 4:30 AM and 5:15 AM at the Visitor Center in the park (see directions/ map). All hunters not checked-in by 5:15 AM will lose their selected status and may join the stand-by hunters. A stand-by drawing will be held at 5:15 AM and at 1:00 PM each day to fill available zones or stands. If there are open positions within a zone, hunters with reservations have the option of changing zones prior to the standby drawing.
3. Hunters MUST check-in and check-out at the park Visitor Center. Hunters may check-out at any time (e.g. lunch) and return to the hunt if hunt staff are notified of their intent.
4. Participants must be at least 16 years of age, or if 12-15, accompanied by a responsible adult who has a hunter education certificate. The adult will not be allowed to hunt.
5. All hunters will attend a mandatory pre-hunt briefing the morning of each hunt. Hunters who do not attend the briefing will not be allowed to hunt.
6. Hunters are encouraged to scout their hunting area prior to the hunt. Park staff will be on-hand between 9:00 AM and 4:00 PM to answer questions. Hunters may not cut brush, limbs, or any other vegetative material in the park. Hunters may only park in parking lots and not along roadsides. Normal parking fees apply. It may be necessary to hike or bicycle to remote zones. The park is open daily from sunrise to sunset.
7. All required Virginia hunting licenses apply and will be checked prior to hunting.
8. Hunters will be required to have taken and passed a hunter safety course. Proof of hunter safety certification must be presented on the day of the hunt. No hunter will be allowed to hunt without proof of having completed a hunter safety course.
9. Every hunter or person accompanying a hunter shall wear either blaze orange or blaze pink hat and upper body clothing visible from 360 degrees.
10. Archery or muzzleloading firearms only are allowed during the November 8-9, 2023 hunt. Archery, muzzleloader, and shotgun (buckshot or slugs) only are allowed during the December 6-7, 2023 hunt.
 - All hunters may only hunt from an elevated stand. Zone hunters must provide their own stands.
 - Stand hunters may not shoot outside the field of fire marked on the stand.
11. There will be no shooting from or across roads, across water, or across park boundaries.
12. In accordance with state hunting laws, hunting hours are one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.
13. Each hunter will reserve or be assigned a zone. The zones will be clearly marked. Hunters must remain within their zones at all times. Weapons must be unloaded at all times when outside of the hunter's assigned hunting area.
14. Only deer may be harvested in accordance with the Code of Virginia. No other game species may be harvested during this hunt.

15. Earn-a-buck guidelines apply. Hunters must harvest an antlerless deer before harvesting an antlered deer. Bag limit is three antlerless deer and one antlered deer per day. Hunters must use their Big Game Tag on any antlered deer harvested.
16. Deer will be field dressed no less than 100 feet from hiking trails, structures, and roads. All deer must be checked by park staff at the deer check station. Information will be collected on each deer, including removal of a jawbone.
17. Hunters may track and recover their deer while they are within their assigned zone or near their hunt stand. Hunters must request assistance from the hunt manager to track and recover any deer that has traveled into another zone or outside the immediate area of their stand.
18. Hunters will be allowed to use portable tree stands at approved locations. We highly encourage hunters to follow manufacturer's guidelines regarding the use of safety harnesses. Screw peg steps will not be allowed. Trimming of trees for shooting lanes or to secure stands is prohibited.
19. Baiting is prohibited. Artificial deer lure is permissible.
20. Hunting with dogs is prohibited.
21. No drugs or alcoholic beverages.

23. The Division of State Parks reserves the right to close the managed hunt or to close any zone in the event that the number of deer taken exceeds that which is needed for herd control.
24. All Federal and Virginia Hunting Laws and Regulations, as well as Virginia State Parks Regulations, are applicable during this hunt. Hunters who violate any of the above regulations will be subject to removal from the park and/or if the hunter is in violation of the Code of Virginia the hunter may be subjected to a Virginia Uniform Summons.

“I have read and understand the above terms and conditions for participating in this controlled deer hunt. I understand that a violation of any of these terms and conditions is a violation of Virginia Administrative Code 4VAC5-30-40 and may result in the revocation of my hunting permit for this hunt, and the elimination of my participation in any hunting program sponsored by Virginia State Parks for the remainder of this season and subsequent years. Any fees paid to date for such programs will be forfeited.”

Required Items Checklist

Please bring the following items with you on the day of the hunt:

- Reservation confirmation letter.
- Terms and conditions sheet.
- A valid hunter safety certificate or legible photocopy.
- A valid Virginia hunting license and Big Game license.
- A blaze orange or blaze pink hat and upper body clothing visible from 360 degrees.
- A safety harness and lanyard

Avenza Maps Instructions

To fully utilize the benefits of the digital copy of the map, hunters should download the free app named Avenza Maps. This app is available for both Android and iOS. This app will allow you to use the hunt map in a similar manner to Google Maps or other mapping software. You will be able to geo-locate yourself on the hunt map, as well as drop point markers and even attach photos for later reference. This will allow you to better locate your stand as well as mark any areas of interest you may want to revisit if you are attending a zone hunt. One of the great benefits of this app is you do not need phone service. The map is saved onto your phone and all you need to navigate is a GPS signal.

1. Visit your app store (Google Play or Apple's App Store) and search for Avenza Maps.
2. Download and install the app.
3. There are two ways to open the hunt map with Avenza: Either download the map directly and open the map with Avenza OR visit the in-app Avenza store and search for the park in which you are hunting. (For example, typing in "Caledon State Park" in the Avenza store will bring up the Caledon Hunt Stand map). You can then download the map, for free, within Avenza.
4. When you're in the park, open the Avenza app, and choose the appropriate map. You will show up as a small blue dot within the map.
 - a. Don't forget you can turn 3G/4G and phone service off so you don't waste your battery or data.
