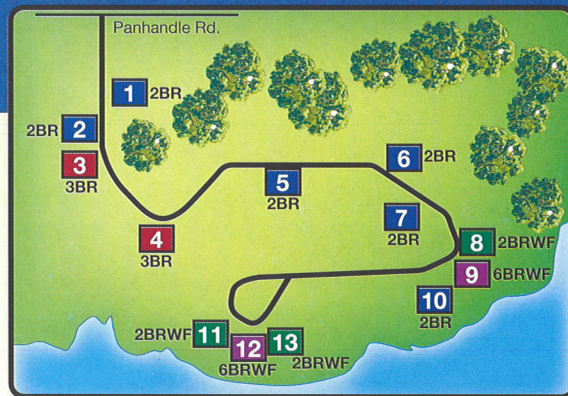

Campsite Information

- Camping is allowed only in designated campground and only after following the proper check-in procedure.
- Registration for a state park campsite must be completed by a member of the camping party 18 years of age or older. This person accepts the responsibility for the remainder of the camping party.
- Campsites are designated to be used by a maximum of six people or one family.
- Two motor vehicles, in addition to the camping unit, are permitted per site. All camping equipment and vehicles must be set up within the boundaries of the site.
- Quiet hours are to be observed from 10 PM to 6 AM.
- No generators allowed in campground.
- Fires must be confined to grills, campstoves or designated fire rings.
- Do not cut, insert nails in, hang lanterns on or tie ropes to live trees.
- Check-out time is 1 PM. No equipment, vehicles, etc., may be left on site after this time. Campers, at the time of registration, must inform park staff of the names of visitors expected to arrive at the campsite area. Visitors will not be admitted to camping areas unless so identified. No visitors allowed before 8 AM or after 10 PM.
- Visitors are permitted between 8 AM and 10 PM and will be charged a parking fee.
- Pets are allowed but must be kept on a leash at all times.
- Parkwide speed limit 25 mph.
- Public consumption of alcohol is illegal.

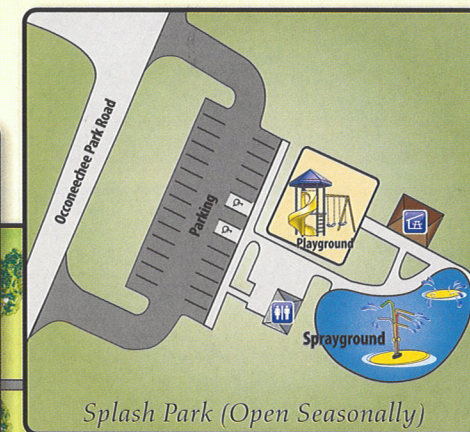
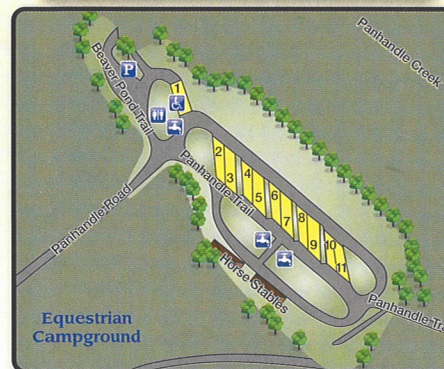
