RMP step by step

Contact your plan developer to discuss next steps.







RMPs give the agricultural community the credit they deserve for conservation efforts. Once your plan is certified, you have certainty that acreage covered by the plan is compliant with any new state nutrient or sediment requirements for nine years.

To help you get certified:

- 1. You receive priority ranking if you apply for state cost-share funds for best management practices in your RMP.
- 2. You may apply for a \$5 per-acre cost-share payment to help offset costs you incurred to implement your plan.
