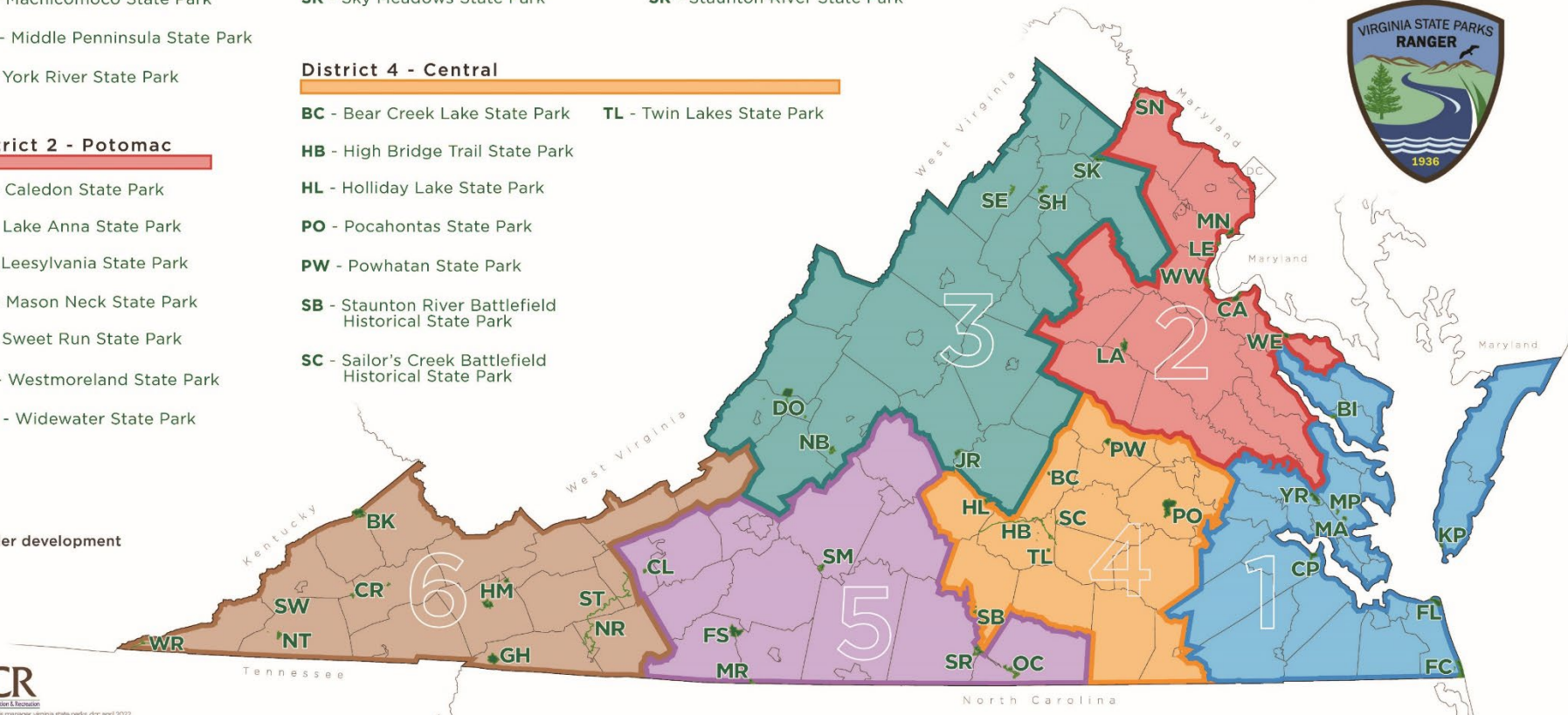

- Joined the Virginia State Park System in 1948
- Museum is a National Historic Landmark
- Features a vast array of cultural resources
- Offers a wide variety of programs and events
 - "Gathering in the Gap" Music Festival
 - Lunch on the Lawn Music Series
 - Acoustic Coffee House
 - Various Children's Programs and Camps
 - WiseJAMS
 - Hoots 'N' Haints
 - Festival of Trees
- Active volunteer and community engagement programs

Park Purpose

- SWVA Museum's purpose:
 - *"to collect, preserve, and interpret the history of Southwest Virginia in perpetuity through educational exhibits and programs"*





Park Background

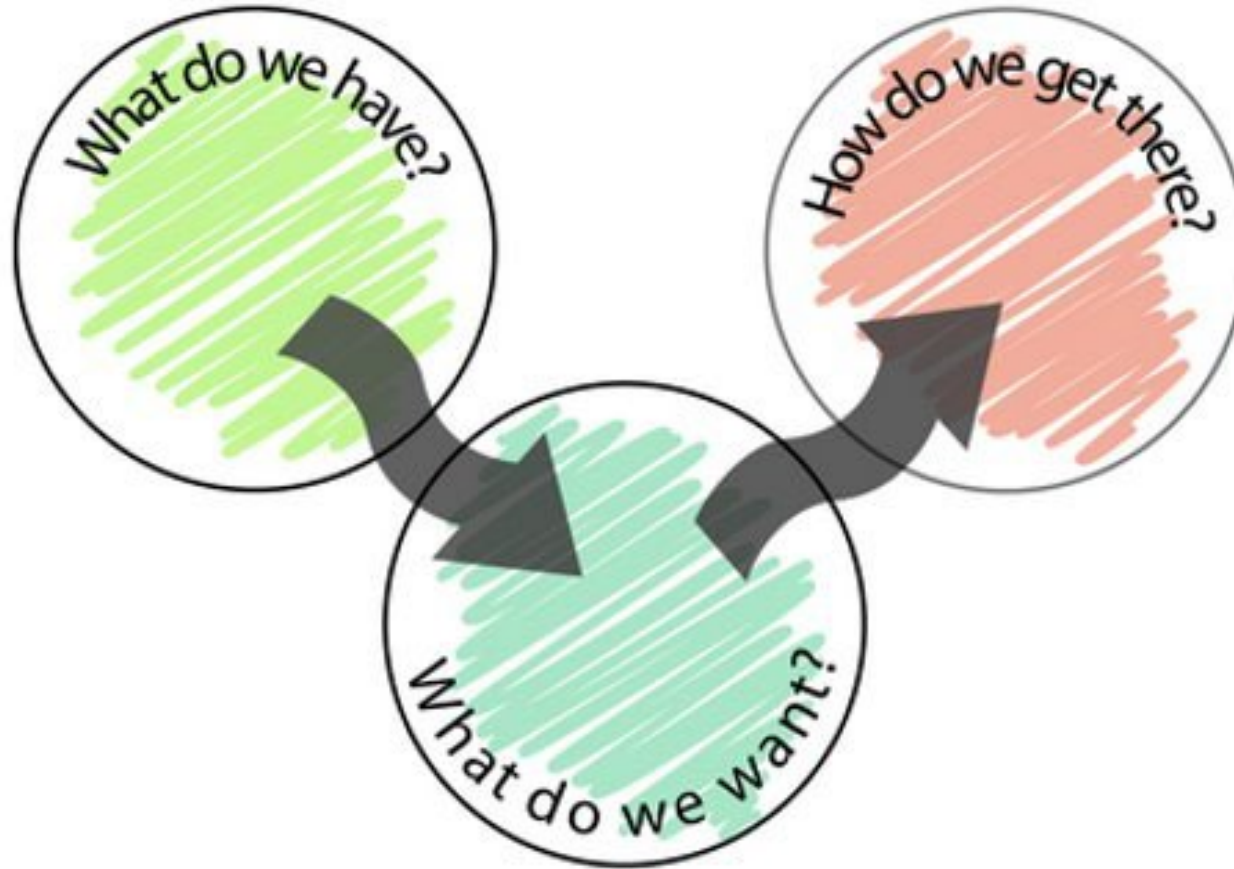
- Park includes the Museum, Carriage House, Poplar Hill Cottage, multiple support buildings, & some adjacent parcels
 - In-progress acquisition of parcel with Interstate 101 Railcar
- Museum houses artifacts conveying the history/culture of Southwest VA & various global artifacts
- Diverse range of educational programming and festivals

- Establish ambitious, achievable Phased Development Plan:
 - Guided and informed by Resources
 - Consistent with Visitor Experience themes and objectives
 - Incorporates Public Input

Resources Lead the Way

The Virginia State Parks mission is to conserve the **natural, scenic, historic and cultural resources** of the Commonwealth of Virginia and to provide recreational and educational opportunities consistent with good stewardship of these lands, water and facilities that leaves them unimpaired for future generations.





Physical Resources

- The Southwest Virginia Museum
 - Also known as the Ayers House
 - Constructed 1888-1895
 - 11,756 sq. Ft.
 - Locally quarried limestone and sandstone exterior
 - Original limestone wall surrounds the property
 - Intricately designed Red Oak interior
 - Purchased by C. Bascom Slemph in 1929, starting in motion a series of events that eventually led to the site's incorporation as a Museum in the Virginia State Parks system

Physical Resources



- **The Carriage House**

- Located West of the Museum building
- Constructed around the same period as the Museum (exact date unknown)
- 2,392 sq ft
- Painted brick exterior
- Currently utilized to store the Museum's Collections while they are not on display

Physical Resources



- **Administrative Offices**
 - Located across the street, northwest of the Museum
 - Constructed ~1940
 - 4,128 sq ft
 - Wood framed structure with mixed exterior of brick, vinyl siding and aluminum siding
 - Currently utilized as offices for Museum staff as well as a staff meeting room

Physical Resources



- Poplar Hill Cottage
 - Located across the street, northwest of the Museum
 - Constructed 1985
 - 1,282 sq ft
 - Wood framed structure with mixed exterior of brick, vinyl siding and aluminum siding
 - Quaint cottage available for overnight rental by Park Visitors
 - Three Bedrooms
 - Two Full Bathrooms
 - Kitchen
 - Living Room
 - Up to 8 Guests

Physical Resources

- Other Structures:
 - Park Manager Residence
 - Maintenance Building
 - Various Storage Sheds
 - Museum Lot's Stone Wall
 - Ball Lot (W) and Leach Lot (NW)
 - Utilized primarily for parking at special events

Natural Resources

- The Park's Victorian Gardens and landscaped surrounding provide many species, including native species, that add natural beauty to the site, enhancing the visitors' experience:

Cultural Resources

- Overall Collection Includes:
 - 4,600+ Photographs
 - 3,800+ Documents
 - 2,000+ Books
 - 50,000+ Additional Artifacts and Natural Specimens

Contains objects consisting of wood, stone, leather, metal, glass, textiles and other materials. Human-produced antiquities found in the collection span at least 6,000 years, along with natural history specimens that can reach back millions of years. With such a vast array of objects, the collection is certainly diverse, and incrementally expanding (within scope).
