Everyone wants to be able to find cool animals, unique plants, or beautiful areas when out exploring. However, many creatures and plants are hidden away in hard to find places, like under rocks or in creeks. Explore Hungry Mother State Park and try out all ten activities below to see what you can find and experience.

The real challenge, can you accomplish all ten tasks without dirtying your sneakers?



Find a rock that you can lift safely and look under it. What did you see? Worms? Beetles? A spider? Make sure you take note of everything you find and then put the rock back softly and exactly where you found it, because this is home to all those critters.





Find a log that you can barely step over. Does this log have moss or fungus on it? Is it full of holes or has it recently fallen? Before you crawl over the log, check the other side of the log to make sure it is safe.



Look for a muddy puddle along the trail and when you find one, make sure to jump high and create a big splash.



Crawdads (crayfish) can be found in all the streams and creeks at Hungry Mother. You will need a quick eye to find one and an even quicker hand if you want to catch one. Look on their belly to see if you see little black eggs. Place them back gently.





Find a spot of soil and use your hands and sticks to dig around and look for a worm. Make sure to take a picture if you find one.



There are many different types of trees and shrubs around the park. As you explore, make sure to take pictures of different leaves. If you don't know the species of tree, just ask and we can figure it out together.



Take a Picture of a Flower

As you experience the forest, keep an eye out for little flowers growing out of leaf litter, along tree trunks and fallen logs, and just off trails. Once you find one, take a picture so you can show it to a friend.
